Ross IMDT in Springdale donates 2,000-plus items to Freestore

Students at the Ross Institute of Medical and Dental Technology in Springdale recently collected more than 2,000 items for The Freestore Foodbank.

During a one-week period, students could donate a food item each day to wear casual clothing, a change from their usual scrubs.

“Not only did the students supply donations themselves, but they asked friends, family and even local grocery stores to participate,” said Laura Kruze, campus director.

That extra initiative helped the school collect more than 2,000 items during the designated week. Donated goods will be distributed among the 420 non-profit agencies that work with The Freestore.

“We’re proud of our Cincinnati students for going above and beyond to collect as many items as possible in such a short amount of time,” said Paul Mitchell, CEO of Ross. “It shows how much can be accomplished when we work together as a team.”
